A landscape-led approach, enabling sustainable growth and creating a place where water, people and nature can come together.




Why relocate?





The proposed development at a glance





Operationally **net zero** carbon, energy neutral and will target a **70 per cent reduction** in capital carbon.

Solar power generation to provide up to **7 gigawatt hours (GWh)** of clean electricity per year.



Designed to treat the waste water from a population equivalent of

300,000

A **94 ha** site incorporating a **22 hectare** integrated waste water and sludge treatment plant.



Proposals to plant over 1100 standard trees, 52000 young 'whip' native trees and shrubs, and over 5700 l.m. of native hedgerows.



Relocation will enable the delivery of a new, low carbon city district in North East Cambridge which could create **8,350 homes** and **15,000 jobs** over the next 20 years.

Ability to comfortably deliver a biodiversity net gain of at least 20% for both habitat and linear features.



•How are we communicating?

- Letters and emails These will be sent frequently throughout the project to our customers directly affected by our works alongside the progress we make
