

## Summary

Cambourne as a new settlement is still being developed, with many homes in Upper Cambourne still to be completed. The open spaces provided have been developed guided by openspace standards from recent development plans, and assessments of the sport and play needs that would be present in the village. More formal sports and play facilities are integrated with areas of Green Infrastructure, including a network of footpaths, areas for informal recreation and spaces supporting wildlife. A play strategy was used in the development of Cambourne and this has proved to be a valuable tool in delivering accessible and high quality formal and informal play opportunities.

Cambourne has a variety of sports facilities, and a range of teams across the sports of rugby, football, cricket, bowls tennis and netball. A new Sports Centre opened in 2011.

The bowls club have indicated a need for small club house facility so they can offer visiting team's refreshments and shelter during inclement weather. A grant of £25000 was awarded for new changing rooms and the total project cost was £512600. Storage facilities were made available for the MUGA in 2006 at a total cost of £10000.
